

Chaplet of Divine Mercy

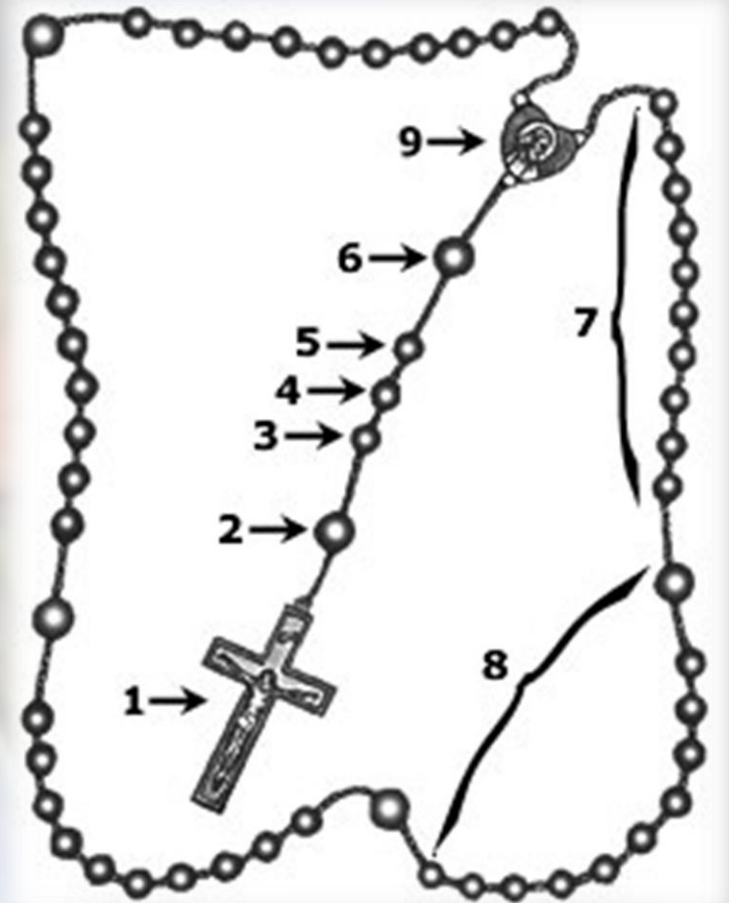
This guide to the Chaplet was created to help you pray the Chaplet.

1. The Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.
Amen.



2. Opening Prayer

(on the 1st Hail Mary bead)

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!



3. The Our Father

(on the 2nd Hail Mary bead)

Our Father, Who art in heaven,
hallowed be Thy name; Thy
kingdom come; Thy will be done
on earth as it is in heaven. Give us
this day our daily bread; and
forgive us our trespasses as we
forgive those who trespass
against us; and lead us not into
temptation, but deliver us from
evil, Amen.



4. The Hail Mary

(on the 3rd Hail Mary bead)

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.



The Apostles' Creed

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

world.



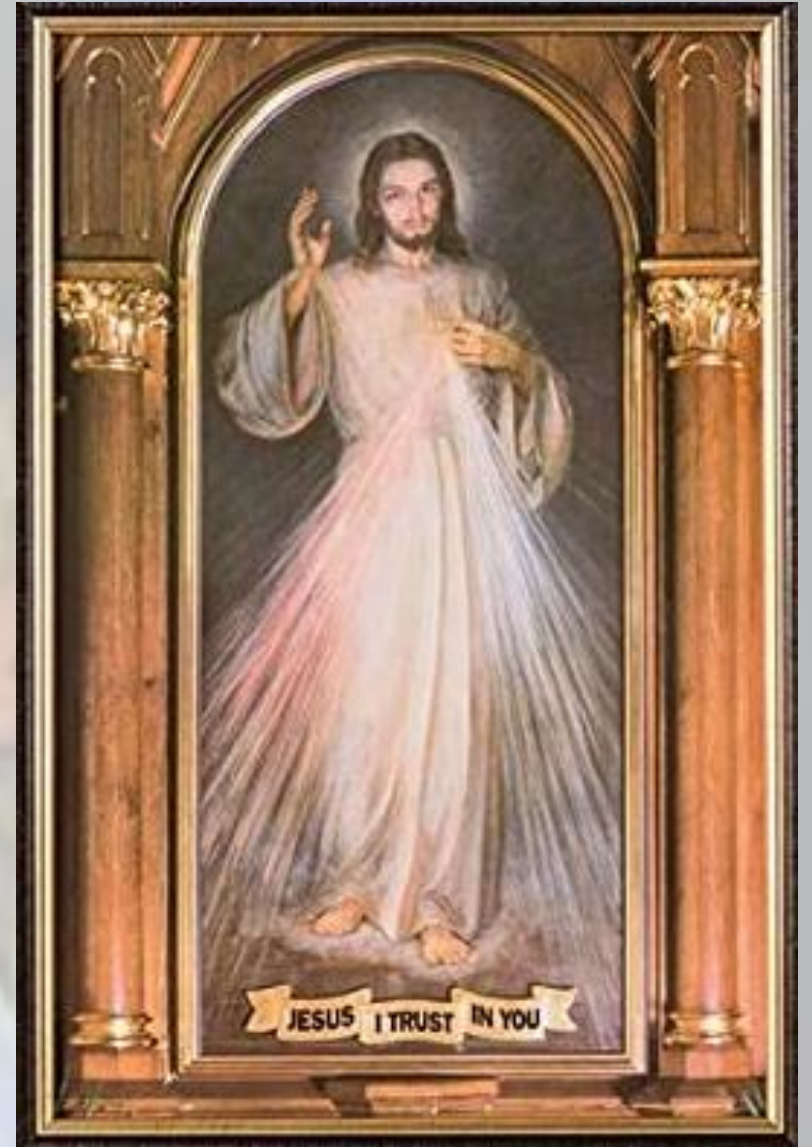
Decade 5

(repeat 3 times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One,
Holy Immortal One,
have mercy on us and
on the whole world.

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

Praying Divine Mercy as a Novena

The Novena to Divine Mercy is powerful. The prayers we just prayed are used each day along with additional prayers/reflection.

Day 1 – Bring to Me all Mankind, especially all sinners and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 2 – Bring to Me the souls of priests and religious, and immerse them in My unfathomable mercy.

Day 3 – Bring to Me all devout and faithful souls, and immerse them in the ocean of My mercy.

Day 4 – Bring to Me those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Me.

Day 5 – Bring to Me the souls of those who have separated themselves from the Church.

Day 6 – Bring to Me the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children, and immerse them in My mercy.

Day 7 – Bring to Me the souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy and immerse them in My Mercy.

Day 8 – Bring to Me the souls who are detained in purgatory and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.

Day 9 – Bring to Me the souls who have become lukewarm, and immerse them in the abyss of My mercy.
